OtherBusiness

The Chairman read a statement for Councillors to agree or disagree regarding the "proposed temporary closure" of the road from Ashmore to the C13, Spread Eagle Hill.

"Closure of the road will cause inconvenience for those living and working in Ashmore who leave the village in the direction of Fontmell Magna.

Considerable inconvenience will be caused to those who require access to the fields on either side of the road. The Council has consulted those directly affected by the proposed road closure and request:-

1. The drilling machine pits (and any associated space required) are sited so as to avoid any access to farm, field or property. Their points of access points are obvious on the ground but approximate locations are on the attached plan.
2. The road from Ashmore to the C13 is open on the days set below. Though outside the boundary at Washers Pit, those within the Parish have an interest in properties close to the C13 so the drilling machine pit should not be located in the stretch of road off which there is an access.

The days the road should be open are:
